Fly

The easiest way to get to Hamilton Island is to drive and catch the **Cruise Whitsunday's** Ferry service. Parking at the Port of Airlie terminal is <u>very</u> limited, so best to book ahead and check out some private parking options in the area (of which, there are plenty).

And make sure you join the **Cruise Whitsunday's Turtle Club** (for those in Post Codes 4877 to 4680 inclusive, to score discounted ferry tickets to and from Hammo!)



There are limited options to fly direct to Hamilton Island from the North (unless you want to go via Brisbane or Sydney), however, flights from southern cities appear to be constant.

You can fly to Proserpine Airport and catch a shuttle bus to the Port of Airlie, to catch the ferry to Hamilton Island.
